## Adding -ing

There are some rules that can help with adding -ing to create present tense verbs.
For some words it is easy to just add -ing.

## RULE 1: Just add!

For some words, we just add -ing to the root word e.g. sing - singing, eat - eating, talk - talking

RULE 2: See 2? Add -ing thats all you do!
If a word has 2 of the same letters, we just add -ing e.g. see - seeing, sell - selling, huff-huffing.

See below:

## Adding 'ing'

Look how easy it is to add 'ing' to these words.

$$
\begin{array}{ll}
\text { see +ing } & \text { seeing } \\
\text { go +ing } & \text { going } \\
\text { eat +ing } & \text { eating } \\
\text { look +ing } & \text { looking } \\
\text { say +ing } & \text { saying }
\end{array}
$$

However, for other words it is not so straightforward.
RULE 3: Silent e? Drop it please!
If a word has a consonant letter (any letter that is not a vowel - a, e, i, o \& u) and then an $e$, drop the e and add 'ing'. See below:

Words ending in e are a bit more tricky!

$$
\begin{aligned}
& \text { make + ing make ing } \\
& \text { take + ing tak e ing } \\
& \text { Can you see what is happening? } \\
& \text { If a word ends in an e you must } \\
& \text { drop the e before adding 'ing'. }
\end{aligned}
$$

Drop the e and add 'ing' to these words:

1. hope

2. bake

3. have

4. love

5. save

## RULE 4: Just 1? Double the fun!

If a word has the structure CVC (consonant, vowel, consonant), where the vowel sound is short and makes its sound, you must double the last letter before adding ing. For example words such as sit, hop, run, shop. See below:

These words have a short vowel sound in the middle. Watch what happens!

run +ing
shop
$+i n g$
runn

Can you see what is happening ?
If the word has a short vowel, then you must add a double letter before the 'ing'.

Double the fun by doubling the last letter, then add 'ing' to these words:

1. sit

## So remember...

- Most words just add 'ing'
- Words ending in e ... drop the e before adding 'ing'
- Words with a short vowel need a double letter before adding 'ing'
