Adding -ing

There are some rules that can help with adding -ing to create present tense verbs.

For some words it is easy to just add -ing.

RULE 1: Just add!

For some words, we just add -ing to the root word e.g. sing - singing, eat - eating, talk - talking

RULE 2: See 2? Add -ing thats all you do!

If a word has 2 of the same letters, we just add -ing e.g. see - seeing , sell - selling, huff - huffing.




However, for other words it is not so straightforward.

RULE 3: Silent e? Drop it please!

If a word has a consonant letter (any letter that is not a vowel - a, e, i, o & u) and then an e, drop the e and add 'ing'. See below:




Drop the e and add 'ing' to these words:




RULE 4: Just 1? Double the fun!

If a word has the structure CVC (consonant, vowel, consonant), where the vowel sound is short and makes its sound, you must double the last letter before adding - ing. For example words such as sit, hop, run, shop. See below:



Double the fun by doubling the last letter, then add 'ing' to these words:





So remember...

- · Most words just add 'ing'
- Words ending in e ... drop the e before adding 'ing'
- Words with a short vowel need a double letter before adding 'ing'
