How to use this book

The Extended Phonic Code series introduces the various spellings for each sound. It can be used with any phonic programme a school is teaching.

The phonic progression in the series can be found on the back of this book.

Encourage the reader to say the sounds in the words and blend the sounds together, using pure sounds, without adding an extra 'uh' sound after the consonant sounds.

High-frequency words are words the reader may not be able to decode at this stage. In the process of learning the Extended Phonic Code, the reader will gradually be able to decode these words. Encourage the reader to sound out the sounds they know and provide the sounds not yet learned (pointing at letters that represent that sound). If the reader is struggling, offer the whole word.

Check that the reader understands all the words in the vocabulary on the page opposite.

Before reading this book, the reader needs to know:

- · two or more letters can represent one sound
- · the spellings <or> <a> <aw> <au> <al> can represent the sound 'or'

This book introduces:

- · the spellings <or> <a> <aw> <au> <al> for the sound 'or'
- text at 2 syllable level
 This text has one 3 syllable word: 'awfully'

High-frequency words:

you, are, too, out, he, said, to, was, one, saw, she

Vocabulary:

haunted - visited by ghosts

dawn - when it begins to grow light in the morning

chalk - a white or coloured stick made of a soft rock

used to write on blackboards

lawn - an area of mown grass in a garden

Talk about the story

Dan camps in the garden with his friend. He thinks that his little sister Viv is too small to camp out. Find out what happens in the night...






Dan set up a big tent on the lawn. "You are too small to camp out at night," he told Viv.



"But I am awfully brave," said Viv.


"Alright," said Mum, "but don't talk all night." Viv began to yawn.

Reading game with the sound 'or'

Play as pelmanism or use for reading practice. Enlarge and photocopy the page twice on two different colours of card. Cut the cards up to play.

Ensure the players sound out the words.
